Justice, Unjust Verdict, Human Rights



HSU Tzu-chiang was pronounced guilty and sentenced to death in a 1995 kidnapping and murder case despite the lack of forensic evidence. After a 16-year effort by NGOs, HSU was released with a life sentence in 2016. Now out of prison, he continues the fight to prove his innocence.

Director CHI has been documenting and filming HSU's story since

2012. The journey brought CHI face-to-face with the shortcomings

of human society and inspired his investigation into why the judicial

system failed HSU by presuming his guilt without any corroborating

In recent years, he focuses on filming documentary and producing commercials and short films. He is currently planning the production of a feature film.



The iron casting master KUO Chang-hsi, now 74, learned the craft from his father when he was 13. Over 100 weapons in Ang LEE's film Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon were made by him; LI Chunhung was a bank clerk, but he decided to quit his job and took over the family business once he realized that his parent could no longer handle the heavy work at their kiln. What drives these people to engage in traditional crafts is their belief that culture and crafts need to be passed onto future generations.

HSU took a non-traditional approach to make this documentary. She hired three real-life temporary workers to play themselves in an abandoned factory, which is both their stage and where they build a temporary home. They live on the edge in between the real and virtual world, between city and wilderness, and between family life and homelessness.

With these workers, the abandoned factory, and the signs that read "help wanted" on the walls, the film reflects the reality of the working class. They are "relics" of the modern industrialization process, cast aside to the empty, barren fringe of cities.

Taiwanese photographer Lifang LIN undertook a solo journey up 4,270 meters into the Himalayan Plateau and lived for an entire summer with some of these nuns and recorded life in the unforgiving environment dubbed "The Roof of the World". There, Lifang LIN captured a life devoted to hope and faith and a people possessing a unique kind of tolerance, humility, and perseverance.

This is a story of the Nuns of the Himalayas, of seeing one's life through theirs, that is, a life lived in faith and with the spark of a summer eternal.

Situated in a desolate, low-lying land in Tainan, Wujia Nursing Home often gets flooded during typhoon season. However, it's a permanent home for a group of patients of all ages, each of whom is challenged by disabilities or diseases and carrying a heartbreaking story. We used to label them as "disadvantaged" and mark the institutions as charitable organizations. The ridiculous truth is covered up and sugarcoated with sweet fantasy, and even "doing charitable deeds" has become a lifestyle or a way to raise social status.

Welcome Home leads audiences through the closed doors, looking into the reality we never really know.

Toxic Bees-Human Intervention, the sequel to Taiwan Public Television Service's Toxic Bees- Nature's Mayday in 2014, continues to tackle environmental sustainability issues. Apart from tracing the mystery of bees disappearing worldwide, this film builds stronger scientific links between pollution, human health, and bees.

The documentary took 18 months to investigate pesticide misuse, revealing the difficulties and pressures faced by beekeepers committed to environmental protection, scientists supporting pesticide control, and scholars concerned about public health. It also portrays how these people, acting with their conscience, advocate new ideas while fighting against the oligopolies that control the agricultural supply chain.

Furthermore, the documentary extends its reach from Taiwan to other countries filled with controversy over pesticide use, such as Japan and the United State. By interviewing people on site, the film covers these contested issues from all angles.

Is this my body? Who am I? As the carrier of spirit and will, how does a woman's body struggle, jostle, collide, and merge with everything but herself? The body seems to follow the mind as merely its shell or tool. However the body does possess memory. It knows how it feels to be tired, injured, sick, fat, being visible or invisible, bearing life or decaying and aging... Have you looked at your body carefully? Everything about you is buried amongst the hair, deep in your skin, down in your guts, or within those millions of nerves. Whether you have forgotten, your body remembers.

We interviewed nearly thirty women and interspersed the clips throughout the film to discuss body's birth, aging, and illnesses during the course of life. Through these talks we learn the diverse female body experience, as if overhearing women's whispers that flow in a feminine tone. As time goes by, though all the questions remain perplexing, this journey, like all the greatest journeys, opens up a chance for the audience to reconsider: What are we looking for?



The story interweaves YANG's facial disorder and his unique works that incorporate the rhythms and discords of human society.

His works address the wantonly discarded industrial waste, whereas his face has been partially paralyzed and twisted for nearly 40 years due to a disease in his youth. For that he has undertaken five surgical operations but all in vain.

YANG is a remarkable performance artist in New York visual art world, widely known for his most praised piece "Kill Me Or Change", in which he showered 30,000 empty aluminum cans on his head within 20 seconds. His performances often dramatize the divided quality of the self, and he frequently uses video projections to create a discordant ambience to strengthen his warning.

HUANG has committed to full-time documentary production since 2000 and he is currently based in Taipei. After graduating from the Law School of National Taiwan University, he left for New York and established his career in still photography.






